



## **NZIQS By-laws**

(Revised November 2008)

### **1 Transition Rules for CPD Accreditation**

With effect 1 February 2003 members who have been Associates for three years are granted CPD accreditation to expire 31 March 2005, for the purpose of application for Registered Quantity Surveyor award.

### **2 NZIQS – Accredited Adjudicators**

**To become accredited on the NZIQS Adjudicators List members shall;**

- a be of membership category of Member (MNZIQS), Associate (ANZIQS), Fellow (FNZIQS) or Life Member NZIQS; and
- b be qualified as a Registered Quantity Surveyor (with current CPD accreditation); and
- c have no disciplinary complaint outstanding which may affect his or her Registration qualification; and
- d not be in arrears with subscription, registration and adjudicator fees payment; and
- e provide evidence of qualifications in or experience of NZ dispute resolution practise; and
- f provide evidence of specialist knowledge of the Construction Contracts Act 2002 either;
  - (1) by proof of completed attendance in a specialist seminar run by NZIQS, the Arbitrators and Mediators Institute of New Zealand Incorporated (AMINZ) or other body as authorised by Council of NZIQS; or
  - (2) by having fulfilled all other conditions above the member is on the current list of adjudicators accredited by AMINZ; and
- g be approved by Council following recommendation by the Selection Panel.

### 3 MNZIQS Criteria (Rule15 (e))

a **New Zealand Tertiary Qualifications shall include** [see Rule 15 (e) (1) (ii)]:-

- (1) National Diploma in Quantity Surveying (NZ)
- (2) Bachelor of Construction (Quantity Surveying) – Massey University
- (3) Bachelor of Construction (Construction Economics) - UNITEC

b **Quantity Surveying Work Experience shall include** [see Rule 15 (e) (1) (iii)]:-

- (1) For approved degree graduate applicants – a minimum of 2 years fulltime Quantity Surveying related work including at least 12 months following **completion**.
- (2) For other approved QS qualification applicants – 3 years fulltime Quantity Surveying related work following **completion**.

c **Overseas Quantity Surveying Qualifications shall include** [see Rule 15 (e) (2) (ii)]:-

- (1) All PAQS accredited degrees
- (2) All degrees and diplomas accredited by the Australian Institute of Quantity Surveyors
- (3) All Quantity Surveying degrees and diplomas accredited by the Singapore Institute of Surveyors and Valuers for QS membership
- (4) All Quantity Surveying degrees and diplomas accredited by RICS for membership of the Construction QS Faculty
- (5) AIQS members 'qualified' as 'Full' Members
- (6) SISV members 'qualified' as 'Full' Members of the QS Division or faculty
- (7) RICS members 'qualified' as 'Full' Members of the QS Division or faculty.

d **Overseas Quantity Surveying Work Experience shall include** [see Rule 15 (e) (2) (iii) and (iv)]:-

At least 3 years fulltime Quantity Surveying-related work following completion of an approved overseas Quantity Surveying Qualification including at least 12 months in New Zealand.

e **Work Experience** [see Rule 15 (e) (1) (iii) and 15 (e) (2) (iii) and (iv)]:-

As defined by Rule 5 y Quantity Surveying work for both New Zealand and overseas applicants includes work of the following :-

- (1) Cost management, or value management;
- (2) estimation/valuation;
- (3) the preparation of Schedules (Bills) of Quantities;
- (4) project financial administration;
- (5) dispute resolution;
- (6) works cost control and;
- (7) other duties that are properly those of a Quantity Surveyor.
