

NZIQS By-Laws – Revised 17 October 2019

1. New Zealand Tertiary qualifications approved by Council:

a. Affiliate membership:

- National Diploma in Quantity Surveying (NZ)
- NZ Diploma in Construction (QS strand)

b. Graduate membership:

- Bachelor of Construction (Quantity Surveying) – Massey University
- Bachelor of Construction (Construction Economics) – UNITEC
- Bachelor of construction (Quantity Surveying) – Ara Institute of Canterbury
- Bachelor of Construction (Quantity Surveying) – Otago Polytechnic
- Graduate Diploma in Construction (Quantity Surveying) – Ara Institute of Canterbury
- Postgraduate Diploma in Construction (Quantity Surveying)- Massey University

c. MNZIQS:

- All of the above qualifications

2. Overseas Quantity Surveying Qualifications approved by Council:

- All PAQS accredited degrees
- All degrees and diplomas accredited by the Australian Institute of Quantity Surveyors
- All Quantity Surveying degrees and diplomas accredited by the Singapore Institute of Surveyors and Valuers for QS membership
- All Quantity Surveying degrees and diplomas accredited by RICS for membership of the Construction QS Faculty
- AIQS members ‘qualified’ as ‘Full’ Members
- SISV members ‘qualified’ as ‘Full’ Members of the QS Division or faculty
- RICS members ‘qualified’ as ‘Full’ Members of the QS Division or faculty.

3. Quantity Surveying Work Experience for MNZIQS membership includes:

- For approved degree graduate and post-graduate applicants – a minimum of 2 years fulltime Quantity Surveying related work following **completion** of an approved qualification, including at least 12 months experience in NZ.
- For other approved QS qualification applicants – a minimum of 3 years fulltime Quantity Surveying related work following **completion** of an approved qualification, including at least 12 months experience in NZ.

4. Overseas Quantity Surveying Work Experience includes:

- At least 3 years fulltime Quantity Surveying-related work following completion of an approved overseas Quantity Surveying Qualification, including at least 12 months in New Zealand.

5. Definition of Work Experience

As defined by Rule 5(y), quantity surveying work for both New Zealand and overseas applicants includes work of the following: -

- Cost management, or value management
- Estimation/valuation
- Preparation of Schedules (Bills) of Quantities
- Project financial administration
- Dispute resolution
- Works cost control and
- Other duties that are properly those of a quantity surveyor
